## 2015-16 School Annual Education Report (AER) Cover Letter

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2014-15 educational progress for the 2015-2016 school year. The number of students proficient at Lee have steadily declined as the State raises the scores deemed proficient. With the change last school year to M-STEP, the scores are difficult to compare to that of the MEAP, as the tests are quite different. As a school we are working to utilize the strategies from Classroom Instruction that Works (CItW). These strategies are research-based and are found to be effective for improving student achievement.

State law requires that we also report additional information:

  - a. Since we have only one school for each grade level, students in Kindergarten to fourth grade are assigned to Lee Elementary based upon the school boundaries.
