We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2015-16 educational progress for Will L. Lee Elementary School. For the 2016-17 year, no new Priority or Focus schools were named; some Priority or Focus schools did exit their status because they met the exit criteria. New Reward schools were identified using school rankings and Beating the Odds information. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap between the highest and lowest achieving 30% of schools. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Reward school is one that has achieved one or more of the following distinctions: top 5% of schools on the Top-to-Bottom School Rankings, top 5% of schools making the greatest gains in achievement (improvement metric), or "Beating the Odds" by outperforming the school's predicted ranking and/or similar schools. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

Lee Elementary is committed to increasing student performance each year on state tests, but the number of students proficient at Lee has steadily declined with the recent changes in the format to the M-STEP. With the change last school year to the M-STEP being an adaptive test, the scores are difficult to compare to that of the previous year's M-STEP. As a school we are
