We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2017-18 educational progress for the Will L. Lee Elementary. For the 2017-18 school year, schools were identified using new definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

Will L. Lee Elementary is committed to increasing student performance each year on state tests and the number of students proficient at Lee has begun to steadily increase. As a school we are working to utilize the strategies from Classroom Instruction that Works (CITW). These strategies are research-based and are found to be effective for improving student achievement.
