For the 2018-19 school year, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

Will L. Lee Elementary is committed to increasing student performance each year on state tests and the number of students proficient at Lee has begun to steadily increase. As a school we are working to utilize the strategies from Classroom Instruction that Works (CITW). These strategies are research-based and are found to be effective for improving student achievement. Each teacher is focusing on Balanced Literacy and the 8 Standards for Mathematical Practices during every daily lesson.
