Legislative – Still no budget from the state. The hope is that a budget will be reached October 1st, but they are taking precautions for a shut down. This week a hearing is scheduled for a committee to discuss budget at the state level. MSBA put out a survey asking how many districts passed a budget assuming an increase from the state; 80% built the budget assuming an increase. Mr. Walmsley stated worst case scenario, Richmond has enough money in the bank to meet about four payrolls. House Bill 4689 has been introduced; this speaks on putting temporary barricades on classroom doors.
