PRESTIGE PORTRAITS

Due to some families not receiving the information sent prior to Winter Break and due to the closure of school the week before the portrait sittings, we have arranged for one more opportunity (at the building) for Class of 2023 students to have their picture take through Prestige Portraits. Prestige will be here in the building on **February 7**. Students must book an appointment with Mrs. Ferranti in the front office beginning on January 19 to be photographed. **There is a \$20 session fee collected at the time of the photograph - cash or check only.**

SENIOR YEARBOOK/PICTURE INFORMATION

Senior Composite: This is done through Prestige. Any student who wishes to be in the class composite must have a picture done through Prestige (either through sessions offered at the school or you can make an appointment). This is the official school composite.

Senior Yearbook Picture: Students may choose the picture they would like in the yearbook. This can be a picture from any photographer, or they can choose to use the one done with Prestige. If you choose one from another photographer, email your picture to rhsyearbook@richmond.k12.mi.us

Picture requirement: size: 1.5" wide by 2" tall

Quality: at least 300 dpi (high resolution)

Format: digital jpeg

We recommend head-shots or pictures from the waist up; if a student chooses a picture from further away, it is hard to see their face.

FAQ's and Other Important Notes

- What is the difference between the Yearbook Picture vs. Class Composite?
 - Yearbook pictures that you choose to submit can be done through any photographer. However, to be included on the class composite and to receive a copy of the class composite, you will have to go through Prestige.
- Why are we using two different companies?
 - Jostens is the company we use to create the yearbook (not to take senior pictures). Prestige Portraits is the company that takes and creates the senior composites.
- Can I just send Prestige a photo that we took or that another photographer took?
 - Prestige does not accept pictures for the composite that are not done through them.

UPDATED ATHLETIC ELIGIBILITY

Considering the recent school closures and staff changeover, the administrative team has decided to suspend the district's weekly eligibility standard. The district will be following the MHSAA eligibility standard. Per the MHSAA, students must be passing 66% of their courses in order to be eligible for contests and scrimmages. In a 6-period day, this would mean passing 4 out of 6 courses.

This suspension of the district standard for eligibility will run through the end of the semester, at which time eligibility will be based on the student-athlete passing all of their courses, per the district policy.

SUICIDE AND CRISIS LIFELINE NUMBER - 988

The new nationwide 988 three-digit dialing code will route callers to the 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline, previously known as the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline (NSPL). Michigan residents in crisis or distress can connect via phone, text, or chat with suicide prevention, mental health, and substance misuse support specialists using a nationwide, easier-to-dial phone number – 988. Calls to 988 are routed to Michigan 988 Centers. Like 911 and other national 3-digit phone numbers, 988 was created to be easier to remember and make crisis care easier to access. Starting in 2023, the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services is asking schools to begin the transition of shifting away from using the former NSPL number on the back of school identifications (IDs), replacing the 800 number with 988.
