### **Virtual Learning Option and Enrollment Requirements**

- Parents or guardians must COMPLETE THE VIRTUAL LEARNING OPTION INTEREST FORM, located on the district's website.
- VIRTUAL LEARNING AGREEMENT MUST BE SIGNED by <u>BOTH</u> parent/guardian and student prior to virtual learning enrollment approved.
- Parents/guardians of students must COMMIT TO VIRTUAL OR IN-PERSON LEARNING IN 5 WEEK INCREMENTS.
- Enrollment/registration packet must be completed prior to student participating in virtual learning if you are a new student to the district. *Schools of Choice* enrollment window closes on Friday, September 11, 2020 for 1<sup>st</sup> Semester.
- WIFI AND LAPTOP PROVIDED BY THE FAMILY. If WiFi or a laptop is unavailable, please contact the ###.

#### At Home Online Learning Expections ...

- Virtual preschool students are expected to be LOGGED IN AT DETERMINED BY THE PRESCHOOL TEACHER.
- **ATTENDANCE IS ENCOURAGED**. If for any reason the virtual preschool student is absent from a class, a parent/guardian should notify the teacher of their absence.
- REQUIRED TO ADHERE TO THE PRSCHOOL HANDBOOK.
- Parents or guardians should NOTIFY SCHOOL PERSONNEL OF ANY TECHNICAL ISSUES.
- FOLLOW CLASS SCHEDULE and calendar provided by the teacher.
- UTILIZE Creative Curriculum AND Microsoft Teams to access observations, videos, assessments and presenting activities completed at home.
- **ENGAGE AND PARTICIPATE** in classroom discussions.
- BE RESPECTFUL AND COURTEOUS TO ALL teachers and students.
- Understand that CLASSES MAY BE RECORDED and microphones may be "live" at all times.





## What to Expect when Learning and Communicating Online ... ... with the Classroom Teachers and In-class Preschool Students

- Virtual preschool students will CONNECT TO THE CLASSROOM THROUGH Microsoft Teams.
- A **350 DEGREE MOVABLE CAMERA**, mounted on the classroom ceiling, will allow the virtual preschool student to see instruction and particiate in classroom activities. The teacher controls the camera and what he/she wants the students to see. The camera will not show in-person students at their desks, unless the teacher moves the camera.
- VIRTUAL STUDENTS MAY SEE THEIR IN-PERSON CLASSMATES when presenting in-front of the class or on *Microsoft Teams*, thus allowing virtual preschool students to remain connected to the classroom community.



- In-person preschool students will only see virtual preschooler when the teacher chooses to display *Microsoft Teams* on the whiteboard/Smartboard.
- The VIRTUAL PRESCHOOL STUDENTS MAY BE PAIRED WITH IN-PERSON PRESCHOOL STUDENTS for small group and partner work collaboration, via Microsoft Teams.
- MICROPHONES IN THE CLASSROOM BROADCASTS THE TEACHER'S VOICE during lessons for in-class and virtual
  preschool students to hear. Virtual preschool students will use the microphone on their device for the teacher
  and in-class preschool students to hear.
- Virtual students will INTERACT WITH THE TEACHER AND STUDENTS IN THE CLASSROOM, just as if they were physically in the classroom.



### Social, Emotional, and Academic Support

- Internal **RESOURCES WILL BE MADE AVAILABLE** to parents and staff through the district website
- Eligible students' SERVICES WILL CONTINUE VIRTUALLY
- IEPs will be reviewed and revised, if needed
- RCS STAFF WILL ASSIST PARENTS who need external resources
