Technology with Mrs. Boettcher



In the younger grades we have been learning how to us Kid Pix Studio Software. Kid Pix Studio is a powerful multimedia software tool for young children. It includes many amazing art tools, animated stamps and special effects, and slide show features that include sound, screen transitions, and video. It allows you to import images, edit stamps, edit text like in a word processor and even turn text into speech. It is extremely open-ended and can be effectively applied to all areas of your curriculum and be used by all students, non-readers included. My favorite feature is the text to speech. The kindergarteners have really enjoyed typing in their names and having the computer say their names aloud.

STEAM

Third grade students completed their unit on extreme weather by designing an building houses to withstand hurricanes out of recycled materials. Then students tested their homes against "hurricane" winds by using a fan. Great discussions were had about why some houses worked and others did not. Students will also build houses that will survive severe flooding after doing online research.

Second grade students completed their unit on biomes of the world. They were given the challenge to rescue their Minion who crashed on a deserted island. They had to work as a team to design and build a boat that would float for at least 2 minutes without taking in water. Thankfully all Minions made it safely back home!

First grade students completed their unit on insects and spiders. Students made spiders and learned facts about spiders, and they designed and created their own insect. Students applied what they learned about insects by making sure their new insect had three body parts, six legs, antennae, and optional wings. They used pipe cleaners, buttons, foam shapes, construction paper, and modeling clay to create their insects. Students gave their new insect creation a name and stated what special adaptations their insect had while presenting to their classmates.

Kindergarten students completed their unit on animals and animal habitats. Students designed and created habitat diorama using paper plates and created their animal out of modeling clay. Students then presented their animal and its habitat to the class.



Over 100 pieces of awesome art from elementary students is on display during the Winter Band and Choir Concerts at the High School Auditorium. The display can be seen **Thursday**, **December 15**th **from 6-8 pm.** Art from the Middle and High School is also on display.

MUSIC



In music, 2nd and 3rd graders have been working on singing independently by learning rounds and two-part songs. They have been learning terms to describe music, such as dynamics and tempo. They practiced reading poems with a steady beat and learned a folk dance called "Highland Gates."

Kindergarten and 1st grade have learned music terms to describe music opposites, like piano and forte (quiet and loud). They love the circle game, Grizzly Bear, in which they sing piano and forte and try not to let the bear see them move. They have also enjoyed dancing with scarves to show high and low.

All students currently in music are preparing for a performance!


