All communities have rules, and to live without conflict, these rules must be learned and followed. What is the purpose of rules? To provide standards to be followed by all people who live in the same environment, so that they can achieve their goals and get what they want, while at this same time being minimal disturbances to others. This is what responsibility is all about.

PBIS is a research-based program which can result in:

- Increased time for instruction
- An increase in positive behavior School wide
- A decrease in destructive behaviors

These Positive Behavioral Intervention and Supports are preventative and proactive, are used school wide, and are based on the three core behavior expectations of Be Respectful, Live Responsibly, Use Caution, then Everyone Belongs.

They include:

- Teacher taught expected school behaviors.
- Opportunities to practice these behaviors.
- Reinforcement for the use of positive behaviors.

How can Parents Help!

- Parents can help by reading and discussing the Behavior Expectations Matrix on a regular basis.
- Require your child to speak respectfully to others, especially adults.
- If your child has a problem in school, review with them the Behavior Expectations Matrix and discuss other possible solutions
- Support teacher and administrative behavior decisions. Discuss problems privately with staff.
- Volunteer to be a parent member of the Lee Elementary School Improvement Team.
- Volunteer to help with the Lee Elementary PBIS celebrations and recognition events.
